Share the Care for March

This month we will be providing support to the **Infusion Center at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta**. They provide chemotherapy, immune-suppressants, and gamma globulins to children from all over Georgia and the southeast. Recipients of organ transplants receive infusion treatment to minimize rejection of the organ. Patients come weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly. The children and teenagers need activities to keep them occupied while receiving their infusions, some of which take up to eight hours.

This morning I spoke with the nurse manager who told me the staff are especially appreciate the support from the Woman's Club because the things we send are so well used and loved by the children and teens. This year they are especially in need of bubbles, crayons, coloring books, (including adult level), and the complex dot -to -dot books. All of these should be easy to locate, including the checkout line at the grocery store.
