## Achievement Award

Congratulations to Nancy Smith, the winner of the Achievement Award for 2021! She was selected in 2020 for the award, but her award was delayed for a year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We are all very happy to give Nancy the award, which she so richly deserves.

First, a little background on Nancy and her life before she came to Emory University Women's Club. Nancy grew up in Chicago. She left her parents, two sisters and a brother as well as the windy, cold Chicago area, in 1964 for college in the warm south. She studied elementary education at Texas Lutheran University in Sequin, Texas, and this is where she met her husband, Dave. They married in 1967 and moved to Houston where he would receive his PhD degree and she would finish her college courses. She then taught 4th and 5th grades and, also, began a family, having her first daughter in 1970.



Her husband's post-doctoral work took them to Tallahassee and then Rockville, MD, where their second daughter was born in 1974. Her husband then accepted a position at the University of Freiburg in West Germany which provided their first experience living outside the States. It was a life-changing experience for the whole family.

Upon returning to the States in 1976 with a two year old and a six year old, Nancy began to work managing the preschools for the Montgomery County Recreation Department in Rockville, Maryland. Four years later, her husband joined the faculty at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Virginia, a small university town. Here, Nancy put more of her fantastic organizational skills to work. She became an administrative assistant in the start-up of the National Association of Corporate Treasurers, and she organized the first three national meetings -- booking hotels, planning the activities, and producing the programs. Her next job was as an Administrative Assistant to the Vice President for Public Affairs of the University. Her third job in Blacksburg was as an Administrative Officer for a new Applied Math Center that was established at Virginia Tech including math and economic professors.

The family's next move was to Athens, Georgia, and she took a job in the University of Georgia Law School where she worked with the Law Students in charge of three

monthly publications from the Law School including the Georgia Law Review. She edited and produced these journals until they left Athens in 1999.

In the next six years, her husband worked in various biotech companies, taking the family to Dacula, Ga, Temecula, CA, Oklahoma City, OK, and Philadelphia, PA. In 2006, her husband took a job in the biochemistry department at Emory, and Nancy Smith joined EUWC in 2007 to our great benefit.

Nancy loves to read and travel and enjoys good wine. Her greatest passion is thinking of others and this is where she best employs her organizational skills that we members of EUWC already appreciate!

“Mom’s superpower is Organization”, her daughters Pam and Kristen told us, and that their Mom “has always been a peacemaker. She tries to bring everyone together when we are all flustered at someone else. She also tends to always think with a positive ‘glass half-full’ mentality and continues to believe that the Cubs are going to pull it out in the last inning, no matter what the score. Mom has a knack for making people feel comfortable when you are around her and she can fit in anywhere!”

Nancy has been co-president of EUWC with Joanie Edmondson. Joanie told us that one of her favorite memories is how the two of them went to lunch regularly at the restaurant Rain to prepare for monthly meetings and large events. They sat at one particular booth for hours each month so that Rain almost put a plaque on it for EUWC. Joanie also pointed out that a proud accomplishment during Nancy’s tour as co-president was the earning of the 501 3(c) status giving EUWC official non-profit status. Finally, Nancy’s leadership of EUWC was so enjoyable and productive, that after 2 years, the membership wanted her to continue for a 3rd consecutive year -- an act requiring changing the constitution to allow a 3rd year under special circumstances.

Besides being co-president, Nancy has led Share the Care, was Treasurer for two years, co-chaired the Benefit Dinner, and oversaw the Scholarships, as well. Her versatility, organizational skills, and people skills have been very much appreciated by each of us.

We miss you, Nancy, and we thank YOU for all your service to this group and the many gifts of service to any community you live in.
