For 103 years we have been providing social opportunities to our members, benefitting Emory University and associates, and giving to the larger community. Our success in achieving all three of these goals has been remarkable as you will see if you dip into some of the history preserved in the Yearbook and Emory Library archives. Here is how we are remembering those commitments in 2022 – 2023.



First, there is the very important social aspect of our club. Most months we have Tuesday Tastings, a lunch outing to a local restaurant, led by Denise Ritchie. This small group gathering is a great way to get to know the women in EUWC. We also have both a Thursday book club (contact Joanie Edmondson) and a Friday book club (contact Margaret Foust). They either meet in members' houses or Zoom online. We have a bridge club, so contact Missy Cody or Cathy Findley if you are interested. Carolyn Arakaki leads volunteers at the Egleston Gift Shop in the children's hospital. Those with sewing talents might be interested in supporting the Sewing Academy of Amani. Talk to Jackie Walker or Alma Owens about that. These are great ways of getting to know our membership.

Serving Emory is another of our commitments. Did you know that we have contributed to the Winship Clinic healing garden, the CHOA Pediatric Infusion Center, the Fleming Outdoor Classroom at Oxford, and the Meditation Garden at Wesley Woods? And, of course, we sponsor the EUWC Arts Scholarship, the Rollins Public Health Scholarship, and the Memorial Graduate Research Fellowship. We want to see that support for Emory thrive. So, if you know of similar projects, let us know.

You will see how we serve the larger community in our November and December meetings. Amani Sewing Academy, comprised mostly of African refugees, will have a bazaar for us in November to benefit us and them. In December we will host Atlanta CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) for children in foster care and will give donations for the children's holidays.

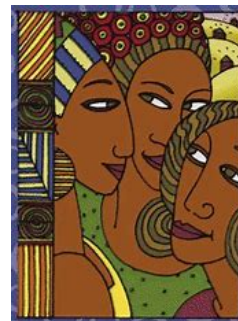

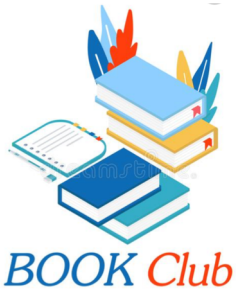




## EUWC speaker on November 15 Doris Mukangu, Amani update & Holiday Market

We have known Doris Mukangu since 2016 when she was the recipient of the EUWC Rollins School of Public Health Scholarship and founded the Amani Women Center in the same year. Starting with almost no funding, she has developed the 501(c)(3) organization into a thriving agency to benefit refugees. Amani provides unique programs that provide aspiring women with confidence and independence. The Sewing Academy, the Healthy Families Program, and the Community Ambassadors Leadership Program give support to the Clarkston area residents. There is an ESL program as well.

Doris will bring us up to date on the programs of Amani, including the Marketplace of handmade creations.
