#### **Share the Care**

Share the Care has been busy. In March our members donated \$565 to the Glenn Memorial United Methodist Church "Snack in a Backpack" program. We learned that \$100 facilitates the collection of 1000 pounds of food so our contribution was significant. Bags of food, including fresh fruit, are distributed to children in three schools on Fridays so that nutrition is guaranteed on the weekends.



In April, our Share the Care Program donated \$445 to the School of Nursing Migrant Farm Workers Program. Each June, select students from the Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing, UGA School of Pharmacy, GSU and Brenau Schools of Physical Therapy, Clayton State University and Central GA Tech Departments of Dental Hygiene spend two weeks delivering vital health care to farm workers and their children in Moultrie, GA. This is the first year that the program addressed mental health issues as well. Our members can feel warm hearts as we were able to contribute to such a worthwhile and educational program.
