October Meeting Presentation - "THE CHALLENGES OF VOTING IN GEORGIA"

It's election time again, and we've invited SAIRA DRAPER, Georgia House Representative for District 90 in Atlanta/DeKalb, as our speaker for October. As a state legislator, Rep. Draper is a leading voice in democracy and electoral policy. In 2020, she led the voter protection effort in Georgia for the Biden/Harris campaign and the campaigns of Senators Warnock and Ossoff. After the election she remained on the front lines, using litigation, education, and organization to combat efforts to undermine election results and dismantle voting rights. In 2021 she co-founded Power the voter, a non-profit organization that funds and supports year-round democracy protection work in battleground states. In addition to voting rights, Rep. Draper is devoted to a number of legislative issues, including expanding economic opportunity, maternal health and reproductive freedom, gun safety, social justice, environmental conservation, and improving public education. She is a first generation immigrant and the only elected official in the Georgia General Assembly who is a member of both the Hispanic Caucus and the AAPI Caucus. A graduate of Georgia Tech and Georgetown Law, she is the mother of three great kids, aged 9, 6, and 3.

Share the Care for October

Our chosen Share the Care for October is the NIA Project. The program is supported by the Medical School and the Department of Psychiatry. This important outreach program focuses on the empowerment of suicidal Black women with a history of adverse childhood experiences and/or intimate partner violence. Women who have felt hopeless and helpless are supported in their resilience and encouraged to flourish, heal from their interpersonal traumas, find purpose in their lives and engage meaningfully in their communities. One of the greatest hurdles to women getting the help they need is the cost of transportation to Grady. Our generous donations will address this issue by providing Marta tokens and parking payment.

The next meeting is November 7 to discuss *Small Mercies* by Dennis Lahane.


