On March 7 EUWC members Jackie Walker and Alma Owens attended the graduation of the Amani Sewing Center, a component of the Amani Women's Center. This was the third graduating class of the Sewing Center whose motto is 'Stitching Lives Back Together". Eight women received a certificate and nine received a new sewing machine. The women wore dresses of their own creation. They were joined by family members who shared their joy in this achievement. Attendees were treated to a buffet lunch.

The Amani Women's Center is led by Doris Mokangu who was recipient of the EUWC scholarship in 2016-2017 academic year. Doris received her MPH in Public Health. The 501(c)3 agency works with refugee women from more than 12 countries teaching health, hygiene, financial literacy, and most visibly sewing skills to empower women to be self-sufficient. EUWC has been a friend to Amani since granting Doris the scholarship and continuing after her graduation.





EUWC Share the Care 2019-2020

January **NETWorks Coop**—is a 501(c)(3) cooperative Christian ministry in the Northlake-Embry Hills-Tucker area. This group of churches, organizations, and individuals is committed to meeting urgent needs. They provide assistance with food, personal care items, utility bills, rent, and infant needs. NETWorks offers Back to School and Christmas shopping at low prices to families in need. Shopping at reduced prices helps parents retain self-respect.

February **Nicholas House**—provides safe housing for families of any size or makeup in order to keep them intact in a shelter or an apartment based setting. Supplying adult education, training programs, and youth programs, Nicholas House focuses on breaking the cycle of poverty and homelessness, following families for up to two years after leaving the program. Their aim is to help families achieve self-sufficiency.
