The generosity of our EUWC is always a pleasure to experience! We delivered \$270 and 2 large bags full of books, puzzles and snack items to the CHOA Infusion Center. The children and parents spend long hours in the center and are grateful for snack food and activities for their children. Thank you all for your support!

**December: CASA of Fulton County** — is a 501(c)(3) organization that recruits and trains community members to become volunteer advocates for abused and neglected children in foster care. CASA volunteers undergo extensive training and maintain monthly contacts with each child/teen assigned to them in order to make recommendations to the Court in determining permanency of foster care or reunification with family.

## Recipient of Share the Care featured on CBS This Morning

In early 2019 EUWC supported Songs for Kids. This 5013c has been in operation since 2007 and was founded by Emory graduate Josh Rifkin. The original purpose was to bring music to children and teens in the hospital. Music can be inspirational to all of us and especially so to those battling serous illnesses. Music has helped children and teens cope with months of hospitalizations. It has expanded to space near Centennial Park where children and teens come to find their voice expressing what they are going through and leading them to healing. The Center has recording full studio and is often visited by national recording artists who love being with the SFK clients. The EUWC donation was just enough to sponsor a recording session for one child.

## EUWC Chare the Care 2019-2020

January **NETWorks Coop**—is a 501(c)(3) cooperative Christian ministry in the Northlake-Embry Hills-Tucker area. This group of churches, organizations, and individuals is committed to meeting urgent needs. They provide assistance with food, personal care items, utility bills, rent, and infant needs. NETWorks offers Back to School and Christmas shopping at low prices to families in need. Shopping at reduced prices helps parents retain self-respect.

Needs: non-perishable foods, personal care items. Lists of items are available at https://www.networkscoop.org/pantry-personal care. Checks may be made to NETWorks Cooperative Ministry.

February **Nicholas House**—provides safe housing for families of any size or makeup in order to keep them intact in a shelter or an apartment based setting. Supplying adult education, training programs, and youth programs, Nicholas House focuses on breaking the cycle of poverty and homelessness, following families for up to two years after leaving the program. Their aim is to help families achieve self-sufficiency.

Needs: new twin sheet sets, new towel sets, new twin blankets or comforters, kids' snacks individually wrapped for after school, cleaning supplies, paper products. Make checks payable to Nicholas House.


